Risk Ranking

P = Participant AL = Adventure Leader

The following quantitative method has been designed as a measure of the total risk evident:

RISK = LIKELIHOOD OF OCCURRENCE X SEVERITY OF HAZARD

Likelihood

1. Remote 2. Possible 3. Probable 4. Likely

Severity of Hazard

1. No injury or repercussion 2. Minor Injury 3. Major Injury 4. Fatal

Overall Risk 1-5 LOW RISK 6-10 MEDIUM RISK 11-16 HIGH RISK

Sunburn	P AL	Participants are instructed to use suncream, covered shoulders.	3	1	4	Safety briefing given to participants before the start of the activity with clear guidelines.

Jumping in the water and hitting another child	P AL	Clear signage, good supervision, clear consequences for disobedience (no jumping rule)	1	4	5	For serious injuries, the Adventure Leader will call emergency services for further assistance.
